It is important that everyone be represented in Utah and the way to do that is by taking the census, however, there is a lot you may not know about it. Get to know the census and how it impacts you—you may be surprised.

 The U.S. Constitution requires a national census every 10 years. The goal is to count every resident of the United States where they are living on April 1 regardless of age, ethnic group, citizenship or residency status. For the first time, the 2020 Census will be offered online as well as by mail or phone.
 The census determines political representation from congressional seats to city councils. Utah gained a congressional seat following the 2010 Census, and has continued to grow. In the 2000 Census, Utah missed out on a fourth seat by just 857 people—showing the importance of counting every Utahn. Census numbers guide district boundaries for Congress, the Legislature, county commissions, city councils and school boards.
• Data collected from the census determines the distribution of more than \$675 billion nationally in federal funding for education programs, transportation projects and social programs, impacting the lives of all of us in Utah.
 Infrastructure decisions, from road repairs to transit developments, use census counts as a determining factor to ensure the highest possible impact of construction projects.
 Public safety uses census numbers to guide decisions about service areas as well as fire stations, police precincts and hospitals. During and after a natural disaster, emergency managers use census numbers to plan rescue, recovery and rebuilding efforts.
 By law, all information gathered by the census is confidential. Answers can only be used to produce statistics with no personal identifiers. Information gathered by the census cannot be used against individuals by a government agency or law enforcement. The 2020 Census will not include any questions about citizenship status.
